

NEW PROGRAM TO LAUNCH AT THE CENTER

As an extension of our suite of International Relocation and Expatriate services, The International Center has convened support for a new program set to launch in early 2016 that will focus on providing a year-long civic engagement leadership training for expatriate leaders.

AN EXPRESSION OF PEACE AND SOLIDARITY



On November 14, more than 50 people congregated in Indianapolis at the Monument Circle to show their support for France and the victims of the Paris terrorist attacks that killed more than 130 people and wounded hundreds of others.

Among those in attendance was Diane Thomas, President and CEO of The International Center and Honorary Consul of the French Honorary Consulate in Indianapolis. Thomas addressed those gathered together by saying, "As you know, fraternité is a big part of what the French believe in. We're here to show our support for those in France that have been killed and murdered."

Jean Minka, president of the Alliance Française d'Indianapolis, organized the rally to demonstrate solidarity with France and said that though terrorists wish to divide the world with their attacks, we must not let that happen.
